Open Access is a set of principles and a range of practices that distributes your publications or creative works online, free of cost or other access barriers

Main types of OA

Open Access Avenues

Embargo

Often the AM will have an embargo period before being made OA

Accepted Manuscript (post-print)

Version after peer-review and before typesetting

Submitted Manuscript (pre-print)

First draft not yet subject to peer-review

Version of Record (Published version)

Final version as it appears in journal after peer-review


Open Access Avenues

NZ universities could massively improve research accessibility

Publishers allow authors to deposit final manuscript copies in our research repositories but we don't. Taking advantage of this would catapult from the 40% shown above to 67%.

TWO out of every THREE publications would be available.

Greater access = greater impact (see Citation Advantage.)

Uploading to ResearchSpace >Login into Research Outputs

Record Creation

Accept the database record of your article



Record Creation

Create a manual record for your Journal article (add new publication)

Deposit to the repository

There is only <u>one</u> upload per record but can upload several files



Upload files

Upload **BOTH** the **Accepted Manuscript**(post-print) AND the **Published Version** (Version of Record)

Embargo
